In her annual Easter Sunday video message, the President of the Uniting Church in Australia, Dr Deidre Palmer, has said Australians are standing with each other in a time of crisis and trauma.

While Easter observances in the Church are taking different forms this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Dr Palmer said that Christian communities were responding in ways to keep vulnerable people safe.

This year's message was filmed on Kangaroo Island in South Australia, where people are rebuilding their lives in the wake of devastating bushfires.

"In the Easter story we see the power of God's love to overcome. From death and devastation, new life and hope emerges," said Dr Palmer.

### RESPONDING TO DOMESTIC AND FAMILY VIOLENCE IN THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

President Deidre Palmer has issued a Pastoral Note just before Easter, urging Church members to be mindful of the safety of people in violent relationships.

"We are hearing reports of an increase in calls to Domestic and Family Violence helplines across the globe from women who are more isolated than ever, and whose social supports and safety plans are in jeopardy," said Dr Palmer.

"In this Holy Week, we recall the way of Jesus, and his life of love and peace. We remember his violent death at the hands of those who resisted his message of love, justice, inclusion, equality and non-violence.

"As we follow Jesus on the road to the Cross we remember all those who suffer from violence in their homes, and at the hands of their intimate partners.

"We encourage you as members of the Uniting Church, in this difficult time, to stay connected with your neighbours, your friends and family."
